

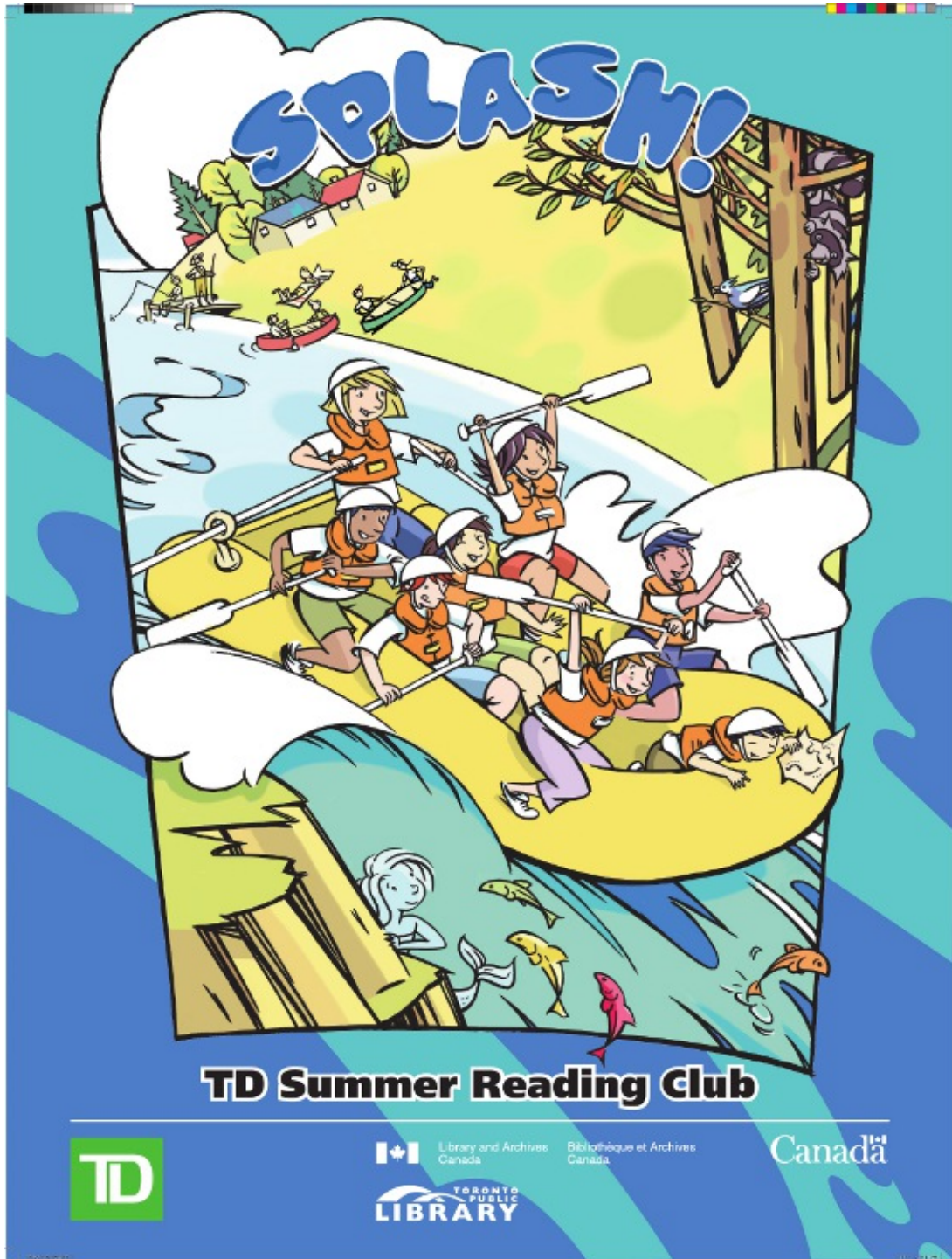

2011 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING - April 28th 2011

Twenty-five designated representatives and fourteen staff/observers attended the meeting. Stephanie Hall and Barbara Bulat brought greetings from Provincial Library. David Richards, Chair of Finance, presented the Auditor's Statement as prepared by Stark-Marsh of Swift Current and he talked about the economic highlights of 2010. The audited statement was accepted.

The Branch of the Year was Rouleau for its innovative, community-driven approach to programming for all ages. **Eddy Moore** was presented with a gift for his seven years of service, 4 years as Vice-Chair, on the Executive Committee.

Colleen Christopherson Cote of Coronach was elected the Chair. **Janice Lamb** and **Doris Dunphy** were elected to the Executive Committee from the City of Moose Jaw for the standard 3 year terms. No rural representatives were up for election/re-election. There are currently five representatives on the Executive Committee from the City of Moose Jaw and four from the Rural Area.

FALL REGIONAL BOARD MEETING - November 3rd, 2011

Twenty-five designated representatives and five staff/observers attended the meeting. For the second year in a row there was no increase to the rural library levy rate. The rural **LIBRARY LEVY RATE** for towns and villages with a **population over 2,000 and a library** remained at **\$22.38 per person**. The library levy rate for **towns, and villages with a population under 2,000 and a library** remained at **\$17.41** per person while the **basic library levy rate** for all other towns, villages and Rural Municipalities was set at **\$11.19** per person. However, a second per person charge of \$0.375 was assessed to all municipalities, including the City of Moose Jaw to help cover the 32% increase to the basic SILS costs.

2011 Audited Statement

In accordance with the provincial financial reporting regulations, previously expensed items are now being capitalized and depreciated. Stark Marsh prepared the financial statements based on these regulations and the current statements are in that format. In the 2010 audited statements changes were made on reporting building, land, vehicles and equipment as they were set up as assets and depreciated. This year the final stage was completed when books that had been expensed were now set up as assets and depreciated.

For a breakdown of how we have allocated our assets please review Schedule 4. We are still investing money into the reserves to save for projected, long-range capital costs.

- All miscellaneous "found" income is dedicated towards future capital costs such as vehicle replacement, system replacement and building maintenance. Allocation is based on need.
- The server contract between Moose Jaw and Palliser Regional Library for replacement of the Dynix server was severed in 2010 upon implementation of SILS. The \$6,200 formerly set aside as the HQ portion of the server replacement agreement to be put toward our share of the SILS server replacement. Effective 2011 this will be held by SILS in the newly set up SILS evergreen server replacement reserve.

- \$5,000 per year in funds received from Prairie South School Division for replacement of courier vehicle, plus the \$5,000 Palliser matching funds as per our contract is allocated to the vehicle fund.
- Books are now capitalized and depreciated on the financial statements and amortized over 10 years.
- Due to the fact that acquisitions did not come “live” until late May of 2010, not all the rural branch book money was spent. The approximately \$4,000 of local branch carryover was used in 2011 to assist with the completion and purchase of more book club kits. Additional funds were set aside to test / restart pre-school programming in 12 of the branches. Rural Branch Sick Leave Reserve maximum was increased to reflect salaries (replace 3 rural branch librarians who work 20 hours a week each for 26 weeks (the time that it takes them to reach eligibility for Long Term Disability coverage). It has now reached its maximum of \$20,000.

ADVOCACY:

Meeting With Provincial Librarian:

Colleen Christopherson-Cote, Terry Gabel and Jan Smith reported at the Fall Board Meeting on their meeting with the Provincial Librarian Brett Waytuck and his senior staff. They met over the summer to discuss the dilemma created by the funding formula which is entirely based on population, not on services provided. Palliser has the 3rd largest collection of unique titles in the province. We have the 2nd highest circulation within the regional libraries. We, along with Regina and Saskatoon, are the “net lending” libraries. This is due in large part to the City of Moose Jaw and its recognition of and dedication to maintaining its materials budget, helping make Palliser the 4th largest collection in the province. These 2 factors have necessitated increased costs as we had to upsize to a cargo van (very hard on gas) plus it has dictated the need for full-time technical service staff. Our SILS invoice is based on services required (disk space for collection, circulation, collection size) and is the same as for Wheatland and Parkland – regions with almost twice our population. Provincial Government funding is based on population and Palliser has the second smallest population of the regional areas. We receive approximately two hundred thousand dollars less in operating funds than regions who are paying the exact same amount for SILS maintenance and who buy fewer materials.

PUBLIC LIBRARY: the hub of your knowledge ecosystem was presented by Colleen Christopherson Cote at the SEDA Growing Saskatchewan 2011 Conference held in Saskatoon on October 18th and 19th. Colleen bravely answers the question of “who Needs Library books when there’s Google and e-books. MAJOR BREAKTHROUGH CAP Grants 2010-2011

Fourteen branches of the Palliser Regional Library received a \$31,300 grant from Industry Canada to assist with public access programming from April 15, 2010 to March 31, 2011.

The major break through that brought the remaining branches under the CAP umbrella occurred thanks to the work of Jeanette Mondor and the board of the Willow Bunch Branch Library. She negotiated with Marie Prebushewski and had her transfer the funding from the closing, non-functioning CAP site at the Métis Association in Willow Bunch to the Willow Bunch Branch Library. We continued her conversation with Marie and had the remaining 4 non-CAP sites adopted by the Saskatchewan CAP federation so we now have new public computers in all branches. Hurrah!!!

Saskatchewan Library Week - Read Local



The theme for library week was “**Read Local**” focusing on the trend for eating local produce and buying local merchandise that has recently become a national trend, so why not try reading local as well? Saskatchewan libraries have unique collections relating to all things Saskatchewan, from local authors, artists, and athletes, to local history and genealogy.

The 4th Annual Teen Summer Reading Club! was a success once again in 2011 thanks to the hard work of our Canada Summer Jobs student, Jessica Lynn Lambert. The program ran between June 20th and August 16th. 101 students participated in one or more activities which included making murals, sock puppet making, Rider Pride bookmarks (in Riderville/Avonlea, of course), birdhouse creations, beach boxes, scrapbooking, storyboarding, cake decorating and candy cone making.

The theme this year was **SPLASH: Celebrate Summer** and, given the heat of this summer, it could not have been more aptly named.
