2013 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING – May 9th 2013

Twenty-one designated representatives and eight staff/observers attended the meeting. Jan Smith, Director, presented the Auditor's Statement as prepared by Stark-Marsh of Swift Current and talked about the economic highlights of 2012. The audited statement was accepted.

A very active conversation was held on how to go about establishing a grass roots advocacy initiative. It was decided to proceed with the mini-petition and letter writing campaigns. Al Birchard of the RM of Excel volunteered to bring to the SARM Fall meeting a resolution on our behalf.

Mortlach Branch Library won **Branch of the Year**. They won thanks to the variety of programming that they are offering for all ages and for their commitment to and involvement in the local community.

Colleen Christopherson-Cote of Coronach was presented with a gift for her eight years of service, 4 years as Chair, and one year co-chair of the Palliser Regional Library Executive Committee. **Ralph Sturgeon** was presented with his gift in absentia.

Terry Gabel of Moose Jaw was elected **Chair**. **Sue Stewart** (RM Big Arm/Imperial) and **Carolyn Ross** (Mortlach) were elected to represent the rural areas. **Stirling Millar** and **Dawn Luhning** were elected to represent the City of Moose Jaw.

FALL REGIONAL BOARD MEETING - November 14th, 2013

The Palliser Regional Library Fall General Meeting was held on Thursday November 14th. Eighteen designated representatives and eight staff/observers attended the meeting. The 2014 budget was passed. In order to cover our shortfalls due to a decrease in the rural population, the need for a public access computer replacement strategy and the need for a salary increase, the new levy has been set as follows:

- Base Levy increase = \$0.32, new base levy \$12.50 per person
- Levy increase for towns and villages under 2,000 with a library = \$0.48, new base levy: \$18.75 per person
- Levy increase for towns over 2,000 (excluding Moose Jaw) = \$0.64, new Assiniboia levy: \$25.00 per person.
- The SILS Support Levy remained at \$0.375 per person and was assessed to all municipalities, including the City of Moose Jaw, to help cover SILS operating costs.

We were honoured to have amongst the attendees Mayor Deb Higgins of Moose Jaw and Warren Michelson and Greg Lawrence, the 2 Moose Jaw area MLA's. They brought many good ideas forward with respect to how to approach the government and what the government is looking at funding. As a result of our pursuit of a recommendation by Greg Lawrence, Palliser has a meeting with the Standing Committee on Human Services in February of 2014 to plead our case.

2012 AUDITED STATEMENT

In accordance with the provincial financial reporting regulations, previously expensed items are now being capitalized and depreciated. Stark Marsh prepared the financial statements based on these regulations and the current statements are in that format. In the 2011 audited statements changes were made on reporting building, land, vehicles and equipment as they were set up as assets and depreciated. Please note that books are now set up as assets and depreciated. For the full audited statements, please see the pink sheet section.

ADVOCACY INITIATIVES

Provincial Funding

Libraries received 0% increase to the base grant which supports headquarters. Due to a loss in Open Hours due to Christmas closures we lost an additional \$511. That brings the total increase to the headquarters operation budget since 2011 to \$3,489.00. We have actively been engaged in a campaign to make our MLA's, the Ministry and the Treasury Board aware that no increase to the operational grant impacts the rural branches and means a reduction in service to the branches. The Chairs and Library Directors met with the Assistant Deputy Minister for Education and will meet in 2014 with the Deputy Minister. Palliser has a meeting scheduled on February 5th 2014 with the Standing Committee for Human Services.

Wireless in Libraries

Wireless is in great demand and is spreading, thanks to local efforts, throughout Palliser. Currently wireless is offered in Assiniboia, Avonlea, Coronach, Davidson, Imperial, Mortlach, Moose Jaw, Mossbank, Rockglen, Rouleau and Willow Bunch. However, we need it everywhere and we are still working to obtain the necessary funding!!!

Moose Jaw Public Library Building Celebrates its 100th year.

Constructed in 1912-13 and officially opened to the public on August 15, 1913, the City and the Moose Jaw Library Board celebrated the building's anniversary with a good old fashioned ice-cream social. Speeches were given and Anastasia Cornea read her short story, "**Good-bye is Forever**", on the life of a Chinese immigrant at the turn of the 20th Century. Laura Shtern gave several historical tours of the building detailing its history and highlighting the architectural features.

Federal Government Invests in Improvements to Palliser Regional Library Headquarters Infrastructure

Thanks to the Community Infrastructure Improvement Fund's investment of \$26,167 we were able to upgrade our 60 year old headquarters building. We reclaimed the training room, created a wheelchair-accessible main floor washroom; made energy efficiency improvements, built 2 new offices and reconfigured the reception and the common areas. Renovations to Palliser's Regional Headquarters will improve public access and energy efficiency of the building while enhancing the experience for its patrons.

"The Palliser Regional Library Board is grateful for the support of the federal government through the Community Infrastructure Improvement Fund," said Terry Gabel, board chairman. "With the growing financial demands of technology and new media in maintaining library services, we have been saving for over eight years to allow us to make these infrastructure changes. We are very excited to see it moving forward. It will help us better serve the citizens Moose Jaw and Saskatchewan."



E-Books: The Bridge to Life-Long Learning

After consultation with our rural and Moose Jaw Senior's Advisory Groups, Palliser applied for and received a 2013 Federal New Horizons for Seniors Program Grant to assist, train and demonstrate the various types of e-books and e-book readers to the seniors living within Palliser. This grant allowed us to purchase equipment, hire 2 trainers, pay for their travel and to offer in 2012-2013 45 sessions or at least 2 sessions at each rural library branch and 6 at Moose Jaw Public Library.

The grant was wildly successful. We saw a 50% increase to e-book usage (25,028-2012 to 37,320- 2013). The limiting factors are publishing purchase bans on libraries and availability. E-books have the same restrictions as do physical books. Only one person can have it out a time and when a book is hot, the hold list is long!

Moose Jaw's Archives Internship Grant



The **Young Canada Works New Graduate Internship Program** through the federal Ministry for **Canadian Heritage**, matched Moose Jaw Public Library funds which enabled them to hire in 2012 **Amanda Oliver** as the **MJPL Archives Intern**. She catalogued and digitalized the **Lewis Rice Photo Collection**. The project terminated in May 2013.

Aboriginal Services and Programming

In 2013, Palliser received **\$11,245** to help us enhance our First Nations services. Palliser Regional Library System used this money to cover 5 basic expenses:

- salary,
- materials (books, online databases, DVD's),
- staff training
- a Lakota craft booth at the PNL
- Plus it was used to cover the additional expenses incurred during Aboriginal Storytelling Month.



TD Summer Reading Club

This year's travel theme encouraged children to journey to places near and far, from the backyard to other worlds, by whatever means they could imagine; and experience new tastes, friends and excitement along the way. 921 youth in 18 branches participated in the TD Summer Reading program with 420 participating in Moose Jaw and 555 rural participants in 17 branches. Due to staffing difficulties Holdfast and Wood Mountain could not participate in 2013.

Regrettably we did not have a summer student or the finances to do a Teen Reading Club this summer. Some branches did offer special teen programs over the summer.

Staff Notes from 2013


