#### ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

On May 13, 2023, Palliser held its first in person AGM since 2019. We had 11 board members and 6 observers in attendance.

# Annual Financial Statement

The 2022 consolidated audited financial statements include our portion of the SILS income and expenses. Headquarters overspent this year by \$15,586.53 which was removed from the Equipment and Building Reserves to purchase a security system - \$5,216.12, 3 computers - \$3.316.39, fence -\$2.115.28 and painting the building - \$4,131.88. The remainder of the budgets had carry forwards of varying amounts which included carry forwards from the previous year. Our financial statements show a huge loss which is directly related to a change in our depreciation on library materials from 10 years to 5 years. As a result, amortization expense for 2022 was \$553,514 higher than 2021. Please visit our website to read the full 2022 Annual Report and 2022 Audited Financial Statement.

#### **2023 PROVINCIAL BUDGET**

Provincial Library & Literacy Office announced on March 22 that the regional grant pool increased from \$6,078,000 to \$6,260,000, an increase of \$182,000. The estimated increase to Palliser's HQ budget is about \$20,000. This is good news; however, we do need to emphasize that an increase has to happen every year.

This will not bring back the staff we have had to lay off over the years. We are short-staffed, and this prevents us from supporting our member libraries as much as we need to. Please contact your MLA and say thank you very much for the increase, but please keep it coming.

#### RFID

Many libraries in Saskatchewan (and elsewhere) have been adopting Radio Frequency Identification including Regina Public Library, Saskatoon Public Library, Prince Albert Public Library, & Lakeland Regional Library.

#### Advantages:

- Can scan all items in a pile at once; this provides ease and speed of both staff checkout, and also patron selfcheckout
- Makes inventory easier as you can scan multiple books at once, sometimes without even taking them off shelves
- Technology like self-sorting systems can be implemented

#### Disadvantages:

- Cost. The tags cost more than barcodes, and the RFID readers cost more than barcode scanners
- The advantages are appealing to larger branches, such as Moose Jaw Public Library, but less useful to smaller, rural branches.

Moose Jaw Public Library will be implementing RFID for their entire collection. To support MJPL and also to remain compatible with other library systems in the province, Palliser will be implementing RFID at HQ only for now. Rural branches will continue to use barcodes and barcode scanners for now.
