# Wood Mountain and District Overview

The Wood Mountain and District community consists of the Town of Wood Mountain, the hamlets of Kildeer, Quantock, West Poplar and the Rural Municipality of Old Post. Wood Mountain provides recreational facilities (museum, campgrounds, swimming pool, Regional Park, and Provincial Park) as well as a fire department, public library, and several churches. Residents must travel to Glentworth for the school and restaurant, and Moose Jaw or Assiniboia for medical care. The nearest RCMP detachment is in Assiniboia. The Wood Mountain Dakota Sioux Reserve #160 is located in the RM of Waverly, 6 Miles outside of the Village of Wood Mountain.

# Village of Wood Mountain

## Size and Location

Wood Mountain is a village with a population of 20 in south-central Saskatchewan, on the edge of RM of Old Post No. 43 and services a large area of the adjacent RM of Waverley #44

- The land area of the village is 1,757.0 square kilometers, and the population density is 0.2 people per square kilometer.

## Facts about Wood Mountain

- Wood Mountain's first European settlers came in the 1870's, when about 35 Métis families moved here after the failure of the Red River Rebellion. Boundary Commission survey teams came through shortly after to mark the 49th parallel. They built the cabins that in 1874 became the first Wood Mountain North-West Mounted Police (NWMP) post. It was founded to run out whiskey traders, and was closed the next year.
- Sitting Bull and as many as 5000 Sioux (Lakota) people fled from the US Army to this area after the Battle at Little Big Horn in 1876. General George Custer and his Seventh Cavalry were virtually wiped out when they foolishly attacked the Sioux, and the Canadian government was concerned that Sitting Bull might attack Canadians. NWMP Superintendent James Walsh was sent to ensure this did not happen. He won Sitting Bull's respect when he rode into the intimidating camp with only a few officers, and Sitting Bull agreed to respect Canadian laws. Within a few months, a new NWMP detachment was constructed in Wood Mountain.
- Wood Mountain was incorporated as a village in 1930.
- Wood Mountain is home to Wood Mountain Regional Park. The park is located 5 miles south of the village.
- Wood Mountain, via highway 18, serves as the eastern entrance to Grasslands National Park – Rock Creek Visitor's Centre.
- Wood Mountain is known for its annual Stampede that has been held every year since 1890. It is the oldest annual Rodeo in Canada.
- The Wood Mountain reserve was initially 18 quarters (temporary reserve in 1913) of agricultural and ranching land but was reduced to 9.25 sections when it was finally received permanent reserve status in 1930.
- The assessment value for the Village of Wood Mountain is \$2,211,900.

## RM of Old Post No. 43

### Size and Location

The RM of Old Post No. 43 is a community of 377 people located in south-central Saskatchewan.

- The land area of the RM is 1,757.0 square kilometers, and the population density is 0.2 people per square kilometer.
- The southern boundary of the RM is the US border with Valley County and Daniels County in Montana.
- The RM of Old Post encompasses the communities of Wood Mountain, Canopus, Elm Springs, Killdeer, Lonesome Butte, Macworth, Quantock, Strathallen, West Poplar, and Willowvale.

### Facts about Old Post No. 43

- Attractions within the RM include Wood Mountain Regional Park, Wood Mountain Rodeo & Ranching Museum, and Wood Mountain Post Historic Park.
- The Wood Mountain Stampede is the oldest continuous annual rodeo in Canada. It has run since 1890.
- The area has produced World Rodeo Champions such as Mark Roy and Carl Olson. The 1996 Canadian High School Rodeo Saddle Bronc Champion, Clair Fitzpatrick, is also from Wood Mountain.
- The Elm Springs Romanian Orthodox Church is a heritage property within the RM. Originally called the Ascension of Our Lord Church; It was constructed in 1926 in the Elm Springs area by Romanian immigrants. Today it is only used for a few services per year.
- The seat of the municipality is located in Wood Mountain.
- The RM is part owner of the Fife Lake Railway.
- The assessment for the RM is \$300,546,600.
